# DISABILITY PROFILE: DÚN LAOGHAIRE-RATHDOWN¹



of the population of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown, or **27,266** people, have at least one disability.

#### Type of Disability

People in Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown reported having the following types of disabilities and conditions:

12,314 Difficulties with basic physical activities

10,057 Difficulty with pain, breathing, or other chronic illness/condition

**6,757** Learning Difficulty

**5.097** Mental health

4,887 Deafness or serious hearing impairment

**2.254** Intellectual Disability

2,183 Blindness or a serious vision impairment

#### **EDUCATION<sup>2</sup>**

In 2016, only 14% of people who have a disability were in education compared to 20% of the general population in Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown.<sup>3</sup> For those whose education had finished:<sup>4</sup>

did not progress beyond primary education compared to 7% of the general population.

had completed upper secondary compared to 17% of the general population.

had completed further education compared to 11% of the general population.

had completed higher level education compared to 57% of the general population.

## **EMPLOYMENT**

25% of people who have a disability were at work compared to 54% of the general population.

### **TRANSPORT**

21% of people who have a disability did not have access to a car or van compared to 10% of the general population.

### **HOUSING**

12% of people who have a disability lived in social housing compared to 7% of the general population.<sup>5</sup>
